


Low Brass sections 4 to 6 – Blow air through horn; no pitch. Follow dynamic indications.




Bells played by various woodwinds and high brass in sections (5) to (6) – Instrumentalists play a variety of high, pitched, small bells (jingles, handbells, etc.) Gently shake for duration indicated. Follow dynamics.



Percussion 1 - 4 sections ① to ⑨ – All individual sounds can be from 1- 4 seconds long; change order ad libitum. Vary the length of individual sounds as sections are repeated. Let all sounds ring.



Narrative II is an aleatoric section. The conductor cues various groups that enter during a particular section. For example, the downbeat is given at ① with two hands and the right hand holds up the number of fingers to correspond with the numbered cues in circles. With the left hand, the internal cues (Perc. 1, Clar. 1, etc.) can be given. The conductor often must follow the soloist for remainder of the section.



Duration of section is 10 seconds long. Conductor cues beginning of section and instrumentalists play as indicated in an independent manner, not in coordination with others.

Score is untransposed.



John Sampen was the saxophone soloist. The work has four sections, each with a distinct character: *Prologue, Narrative I, Narrative II, Epilogue*.
